



## Product Overview: ProQuest Dissertations & Theses

ProQuest is a global leader in collecting, organizing and distributing value-added information to researchers. **ProQuest Dissertations & Theses (PQDT)** is the world's most comprehensive collection of dissertations and theses, with more than 2.7 million doctoral dissertations and master's theses included, covering graduate research from 1743 to the present.

### ProQuest Dissertations & Theses

With more than 2.7 million entries, ProQuest Dissertations & Theses (PQDT) is the database of record for doctoral dissertations and master's theses. The database represents the work of authors from over 1,700 graduate schools and universities in North America and from around the globe. Over 70,000 new dissertations and theses are added to the database each year.

The database includes bibliographic citations for materials ranging from the first U.S. dissertation, accepted in 1861, to those accepted as recently as last semester. Citations for dissertations published from 1980 forward also include 350-word abstracts written by the author. Citations for master's theses from 1988 forward include 150-word abstracts. The full text of more than 2 million of these titles is available in paper, microform, and electronic (if subscription allows) formats. Institutional subscribers to ProQuest Dissertation & Theses Full-Text receive online access to the complete file of dissertations in digital format starting with titles published from 1997 forward (about 1.2 million graduate works are available in PDF – as of July 2010).

PQDT offers access to the first 10% of the dissertation (up to 24 pages) for those dissertations and theses available in electronic form.

PQDT is updated weekly and features 22 indexed and searchable fields, including full text searchability.

ProQuest has seen an increase in dissertations and theses that include supplementary digital materials — audio, video, presentations, spreadsheets, etc. To properly support scholarly access to these materials, ProQuest is now making them available online in the Full Text version of the ProQuest Dissertations & Theses (PQDT) database.

### Administration / Setup

Library staff can make changes to their ProQuest account through the ProQuest Local Administrator (LAD) utility.

ProQuest usage statistics are retrieved using the ProQuest LAD utility.
